Conditions:

- Articles include: cardigans, jerseys, shawls, hats etc
- Commercial yarn label to be attached securely to entries into classes 1924 – 1935 & 1940 – 1942
- Natural fibres include wool, mohair, angora, silk, cotton, alpaca etc classes 1925 – 1932
- Sample of fibre to be attached securely to classes 1936 – 1938
- No accessories on garments e.g pins or brooches
- Each entry must be marked with section name and class number

1925	Handknitted article, aran all over pattern
