

## Entries

Entry closing dates

17 <sup>th</sup> February 2023	Equestrian, dog and sheep sections
4 <sup>th</sup> March 2023	3-6:45pm Indoor section entries can be brought to the hall
5 <sup>th</sup> March 2023 *BEFORE 8:30am*	Indoor sections entries must be in the hall

Entries must be accompanied by necessary entry fees and all entries must be named.

Fees paid do not entitle you to free ground entry unless you are a member of the association/

All entry forms must be signed, legible, have required certificates attached, entry form calculated correctly, and subscription paid if a member. Incorrect entry forms will be returned by email or phone call made for correction. Confirmation emails will be sent after processing, it is your responsibility to check the details, are correct and advise the secretary prior 25<sup>th</sup> February of any errors.

## Membership

The Rai Valley A&P Show is run by a committee of volunteers. As a not-for-profit community organization, we are reliant on a successful day, sponsorship and membership subscriptions.

Exhibitors aged 17 years and over must pay full entry fees unless members.

Members will receive 2 Adult and 2 Children passes, all other persons will be admitted to the show grounds upon paying the usual admittance fee, whether exhibitors or not.

## Grand Parade

The Grand Parade begins around 12:30pm (approx. on show day, all place winners are expected to parade. Any Horse and Pony prize winners not taking part in the Grand Parade may have their prize money forfeited.

## Trophies and Prizes

Trophies are not given out. They are awarded

Trophies or special prizes maybe substituted by sponsors

To each class of Sheep, Cattle and Horse and Pony, two prizes may be awarded. When there are seven or more entries in one class, third prize money may be paid to the value of half of the value of the second prize.

## Cancellations and refunds

No refunds are given for classes not entered on the day. Substitution of another animal will not be permitted without the consent of the stewards and notification of the office. Contact the section Head at the earliest opportunity. Please If an animal is scratched due to illness or injury, 80% of entry fees will be refunded on receipt of a vet certificate and letter requesting a refund.

The association shall not be liable to the exhibitor for any compensation whatsoever as a result of the cancellation or postponement of the show.

The association reserves the right to combine, split or delete classes according to entries received All exhibits must be on the show grounds and ready for judging at the time stated on the schedule, any exhibits not ready will be liable for disqualification.

## Conditions of entry

- Please read these Section Conditions alongside the General Conditions of the Rai Valley A&P Show.
- The equestrian section convenor reserves the right to change classes or conditions.
- Only paid members of the association will be issued with gate passes. All non-members must pay gate entry fees.
- Height certificates and performance cards to be carried unless entering in Sections 5 or 8 (Hand Coloured & Future Stars).

## Camping Information

Camping on site is available for Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March. Please contact the secretary to book. Campers are still required to pay gate fees.

- Entry through Gate 4.
- No facilities or power is available
- Port-a-loo onsite
- No permanent yard for horses is available
- Temporary pens can be erected overnight but these must be removed before 8:30 am 4<sup>th</sup> March. This is a RAS rule and MUST be followed.
- Water trough is available for horses
- No entry into the cattle area of the showgrounds
- These grounds are private property, please 'leave them as you find them'
- No charges. Happy camping 😊

## Guidelines for Entering Saddle Events:

- OPEN CLASSES – All Horses and Ponies may enter including Novices
- NOVICE CLASSES – A Novice is a Horse or Pony that has won 0-5 firsts in a conformation class, at any A&P Show, at the time of the show, unless otherwise specified. Once a Horse or Pony has had 6 wins it is no longer eligible to enter Novice classes.

If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins before the day of the show, the competitor must advise the secretary and may change to an Open class or if no class remains to enter a refund will be given at the such time the show committee decides.

Novice Champions are not eligible for Open Championships unless they have won their Open class, nor are they eligible for Supreme.

- LADY'S and GENTLEMAN'S classes – Wins count as an Open Conformation Class.

All Horses and Ponies must be named. No Ponies are allowed in any Horse classes unless stated.

In all rings first prize winners only are to parade for Champion, and the second placed animals are to stand by for Reserve Champion.

## HATS/HELMENTS

- a) In all cases current Work Safe New Zealand rules prevail.
- b) All riders, including harness drivers/with the exclusion of heavy horses (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS-affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within a

Showgrounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event.

c) Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards may be subject to change but the latest list can be found at <http://www.ras.org.nz – equestrian>. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook.

d) All hats/helmets that conform as per c) must be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS.

**Please note:** As from 1 August 2023, Standards are changing and a 'Yellow' Tag must be shown.

### The Yellow Card System:

This show supports the RAS “Yellow Card System”, which will operate in the Equestrian Section of all affiliated show and will be offered for any inappropriate behavior towards show officials, judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the show bringing the equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/or Exhibitors as provide in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges rulebook and rule 13 of the RAS Constitution”. Implementation of the ‘Yellow Card’ will be in accordance of the RAS Rules that accompanied this card, and full wording of the ‘Yellow Card System’ is available to view on the RAS website. In all Hack and Pony classes at the Rai Valley A & P show (exempt - In Hand Coloured and Future Stars rings) a current height and performance card must be carried and shown to the ring steward.

Miniature Horse classes: Category A up to 34 inches, - Category B up to 38 inches

All miniature horse entries must be registered with the NZMHA. Miniature Horse height for age rules applies to all horses competing in this section. Classes will be run under the NZMHA rules. The current RAS height certificate and copy the Breed Registration certificate must be available for viewing on request.

Your signature on the entry form denotes acceptance of these conditions. All entry forms must be signed by authorize person 18 years and older.
